GENERAL REGULATIONS – SECTION 1

1.01.

Compliance with rules and regulations:

(a)

Any permission granted by the Airport Authority directly or indirectly, expressly, by implication or otherwise to any person to enter or to use the airport or any part thereof is conditioned upon strict compliance with these rules and regulations.

(b)

Any permission granted by the Airport Authority under these rules and regulations is conditioned upon the payment of any and all applicable fees and/or charges established by the Airport Authority.

1.02.

Reserved.

1.03.

Advertising and display. No person shall post, distribute, or display signs, advertisements, literature, circular, pictures, sketches, drawings, or other forms of printed or written matter at the airport without first obtaining written permission from the Airport Authority.

1.04.

Solicitation:

(a)

No person shall solicit fares, alms or funds for any purpose on the airport without first applying for and obtaining a permit from the Airport Authority. All prospective solicitors and any person granted permission to solicit on the airport shall comply with the minimum requirements set out in section 496.425, Florida Statutes (1991), or as amended, renumbered or replaced. Because of the limited number of areas on the airport where solicitation in compliance with the statute may safely occur, the following rules apply to the issuance of solicitation permits in addition to the statutory requirements:

1.

No more than two (2) permits shall be issued and outstanding at any given time. All permits shall be issued to qualified solicitors on a "first-come, first-served" basis.

2.

Solicitation may occur only between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m., seven (7) days per week.

3.

For each permit holder the permit shall designate a single fixed area of the airport from which the permit holder may solicit. No more than three (3) persons may solicit at the fixed area at any one time.

4.

Solicitation without a permit, filing a permit application containing false information or violation of any condition of a permit issued under these regulations is grounds for immediate revocation of any permit issued under these regulations, prohibition of all further solicitation and imposition of all penalties for violation of this article as set forth below.

(b)

No person authorized to accept tips for services performed at the airport shall solicit a tip, or a specific amount of tip, nor harass, insult or intimidate a person for whom a service is being performed.

1.05.

Leafletting. No person shall distribute leaflets or other printed matter on the airport without first applying for and receiving a permit from the director of the operations department. Subject to the following conditions, a permit shall be issued immediately on receipt of the application:

(a)

Permits are good for a continuous forty-eight-hour period. Upon receipt of a new application, a permit shall be issued for a second continuous forty-eight-hour period if issuance of the permit will not exceed the maximum number of permits issued at any one time. No person may obtain more than two (2) permits per month.

(b)

In order to avoid congestion, no more than two (2) permits shall be issued at a time.

(c)

The permit shall designate a site for the distribution which provides the distributors access to the public while ensuring the free flow of pedestrian and vehicular traffic and avoiding congestion. Placement of tables, booths, counters or any other structure is expressly prohibited. The use of loud speakers, microphones, amplifiers or bull horns is expressly prohibited. All leafletting shall be conducted in a peaceful and nonthreatening manner. Should a person refuse to accept printed matter, the distributor shall refrain from any further attempt to distribute it. Use of

threatening language, gestures or physical contact by the distributors is expressly prohibited.

(d)

Leafletting without a permit, filing a permit application containing false information or violation of any condition of a permit issued under these regulations is grounds for immediate revocation of any permit issued under these regulations, prohibition of all further leafletting and imposition of all penalties for violation of this article as set forth below.

(e)

For each permit holder the permit shall designate a single fixed area of the airport from which the permit holder may solicit. No more than three (3) persons may distribute leaflets or other printed matter at the fixed area at any one time.

1.06.

Restricted areas. No person shall enter the AOA or a restricted area of the airport, except:

(a)

Persons who enter in accordance with security clearance pursuant to the security program established by the Airport Authority and authorized by the FAA for the particular airport involved or;

(b)

Persons assigned duties on the AOA or other restricted areas and bearing a proper security identification badge; or

(c)

Employees or authorized representatives of the Airport Authority or other federal, state or local governmental agencies, having proper business in the AOA or restricted area and bearing a proper security identification badge; or

(d)

Passengers under appropriate supervision of air carrier or authorized Airport Authority personnel, entering upon the aircraft apron for the purpose of enplaning or deplaning an aircraft.

1.07.

Picketing, marching and demonstration. No person may participate in a picket line as a picket or take part in any form of demonstration on any part of the airport without first applying for and obtaining a written permit from the executive director or his/her designated representative for such picketing or other permitted demonstration. The permit shall designate specific areas where the picketing or

demonstration may occur. Picketing or demonstrations are specifically prohibited inside any airport building or structure or in any area which prevents ingress or egress to the airport premises or to any airport building, structure or parking facility. Any such activity shall be conducted:

(a)

In a peaceful and orderly manner contemplated by law, without physical harm, molestation, threat or harassment of persons, obscenities, violence, breach of the peace or other unlawful conduct;

(b)

Without obstructing the use of the airport by others and without hindrance to or interference with the proper, safe, orderly and efficient operation of the airport and the activities conducted thereupon; and

(c)

Picketing or demonstration without a permit, filing a permit application containing false information or violation of any condition of a permit issued under these regulations is grounds for immediate revocation of any permit issued under these regulations, prohibition of all further picketing or demonstration and imposition of all penalties for violation of this article as set forth below.

1.08.

Operating procedures, emergency procedures and directives. Written operating procedures issued by the executive director or his/her designated representative from time to time shall be implemented and used to guide routine operations.

(a)

When an emergency exists at the airport, the executive director or his/her designated representative shall be empowered to take action which is necessary or desirable to protect the health, welfare and safety of persons or property and to facilitate the safe and secure operation of the airport.

(b)

Consistent with adopted operating and emergency procedures and the rules and regulations established in this article, the executive director, or his/her designated representative, shall at all times have the authority to take such reasonable action as may be necessary for the proper handling of the conduct and management of the public in attendance at the airport.

1.09.

Tampering. Locks, doors, heater/air conditioner thermostats, lights in public areas and any other airport machinery or equipment shall not be tampered with at anytime. No person other than an authorized airport employee shall turn

heaters or air conditioners in public areas on or off, or operate any other airport equipment.

1.10.

Security devices and directives. No unauthorized person shall in any way tamper or interfere with security alarms, locks or closing mechanisms of any door or gate on the airport leading to the air operations area or a restricted area nor shall any person otherwise breach any security directive at the airport.
